

Curriculum Intent

This qualification aims to introduce study of the sector and is for the student interested in learning about the health and social care sector as part of a balanced study programme. It is intended as an Applied General qualification and is equivalent in size to one A level. It supports access to a range of higher education courses, possibly in health and social care, if taken alongside further level 3 qualifications. The qualification typically makes up one-third of a study programme.

This qualification is designed primarily to support progression to employment via higher education. It also supports students choosing to progress directly to employment as the transferable knowledge, understanding and skills will give successful students an advantage in applying for a range of entry level roles, industry training programmes and Higher Apprenticeships, for example, the Adult Social Care Apprenticeship or the Allied Health Profession Support Apprenticeship.
