Safeguarding

A Government consultation, focusing on finding ways to reduce the number of children using vapes in England, has been launched, Although the latest data shows that most teenagers are not using vapes (91%), usage has almost doubled in a year. Doctors are expressing concern and want to target this. Did you know:

- Vapes are age restricted, only legally allowed to be sold to persons over 18.
- There are a vast array of counterfeit vapes available, that potentially cause more harm. The aim is to crack down on this as well as stop vape sales to children

Pupil Premium Funding the cost of living crisis

The cost of living crisis is affecting everyone in different ways. We are wanting to support all in our community in whatever ways that we can.

Uniform – if you have any items that your children have outgrown but that is still good quality perhaps you could donate that to school? If you need uniform, then please contact your child's tutor or Achievement Leader and we will see what we can do to support you with this.

Free School Meals - If your circumstances have changed you may be eligible to claim free school meals for your child. We know that parents are often reluctant to claim this as they are concerned others will know about it but as we operate a cashless system the meal would be claimed in the same way as if it was paid for using the Arbor account. Please make this claim if you are eligible as it provides access to other types of support that will allow your child to take part in enrichment activities and school trips.
