# Part A: Curriculum music

#### **Curriculum time:**

- **KS3** 3 hours a fortnight taught by a specialist teacher. To ignite and sustain a love for music through a musical journey.

- At KS3 students follow the National Curriculum content focusing on a variety of knowledge rich lessons in Performing, Composing/Creating, Listening, Appraising and Catholic Character.
- CTK Music is fully informed by the KS3 model music curriculum (March 2021)
- Students are taught the keyboard (whole class by the Head of Music) within curriculum lessons and this is also explored in composition and music technology on synth roll.
- Students are also expected to sing during Mass and in curriculum topics such as The Blues and Pop & Rap during KS3.
- Students become creative as individuals and in ensembles when composing using their voices, percussion, keyboards and their own instruments/voice, producing some imaginative pieces of music.

 Music is fully inclusive with access to the Music Studio and curriculum for every SEND student. Moving to Btec Music Practice has seen an increase in SEND students opting for this course at KS4 level.
