

# Mock Interview Week



### What is a mock interview?

- A mock interview is a practice interview that simulates the experience of a real job interview.
- It's a chance to practice answering questions, get feedback on your performance, and become more comfortable with the interview environment.



### Benefits of a mock interview:

#### **Building confidence**

Mock interviews can help you feel more prepared and confident for the real interview.

#### Improving communication skills

You can practice nonverbal cues like eye contact, posture, and hand gestures to convey confidence and professionalism.

#### **Getting feedback**

You can receive feedback on your performance, including your attire, mannerisms, and body language.

#### Getting used to the interview environment

You can get accustomed to the pacing and environment of an interview.



## Expectations of the interview

- Make sure you know your interview time details will be shared with form tutors and the timetable will be outside U7.
- You need to come <u>smartly dressed</u> correct uniform (Y10), professional/business attire (Y12).
- You should be outside the venue for your interview, <u>5 minutes before</u> that time. The interview will be around 15-20 minutes.
- You should begin your interview by saying 'Good morning' and introducing yourself.
- You will be asked questions which are on the following slide.
- You will receive <u>feedback at the end of the interview</u>, you will then get a few minutes at the end to jot this down after your interview.



# Questions you will be asked:

- 1. Tell me a little about yourself
- 2. What would your friends say about you?
- 3. What subjects are you studying? (Do you have a favourite?)
- 4. What are you plans at the end of Year 11 or Year 13? (College/apprenticeship?)
- 5. What is your greatest strength?
- 6. Why would you be a good person to employ?
- 7. I have looked at your CV tell me about...

#### More "situational" questions could be:

- Describe a time when you were faced with a problem and how you dealt with it
- 2. Explain how well you work with other people
- 3. Tell me how effectively you work when not directly supervised
- Don't be surprised if, as your interview progresses, you are asked questions prompted by your responses.
