Area for Improvement:

Music will improve by:

- Develop/adapt the KS3 curriculum to meet the demands of a 3 year KS3 model from September 2026
- Continue working on links between KS3 curriculum and KS4 BTEC curriculum in line with NC guidelines
- Explore Level 3 courses options for 2026 promote retention Post 16
- Reducing the attainment gap between Disadvantaged and PP students and non Disadvantaged/PP students.
- Continue to use Catholic Character more audibly in lesson
- Focus on Moderation Moderator's Report for C1 highlighted significant concerns about generous marking.
- Continue to develop links with BTEC leaders in other schools through network meetings.
- To raise the number of students achieving higher grades (L2D*, L2D, L2M) in line with FFT targets
- To host live music events in line with OLOL requirements (led by RSH in the interim)
