Y10 Mock Interview Assembly Tuesday 4th November

Students will have the process of mock interviews explained to them during an assembly in afternoon registration.

Students will be told they need to prepare a CV and send/show it to their form tutor by **Friday 7th November**.

They will need to bring their CV to their interview to **show the employer**.

They need to be in full school uniform, they will have a **15 minute appointment** which will be shared with them and tutors. This will also be on Arbor for teachers to be aware of students missing part of the lesson.

How to Write a CV – Example

Name Home Address Contact details Mobile Phone Number Email Address Personal Profile Introduction A summary to highlight your key skills and attributes, making it specific to the job you're applying for. This section should be approximately 100 words. **Education and Qualifications** Start with the most recent first. Date School/college Education history A Level grades/predicted grades. Date School GCSE grades/predicted grades, including English and maths. Work Experience Start with the most recent first. Date Company name and job title. Work experience Main responsibilities. Skills gained (teamwork, interpersonal, problem-solving etc). Skills and Achievements Explain how these particular skills and achievements would help you in the job you're applying for, for example: I am skilled in using spreadsheet software. As part of my role at Joe Blog's Corner Shop, I had to maintain a list of stock and update it with sales and deliveries. Skills and interests Interests and Activities Try to keep these relevant to what the potential employer is looking for.

CV Deadline – Friday 7th November

Students will be told what a CV is, why they need one and what to include. A template will be sent to them via email for them to use. This needs to be **printed before their interview** (their form tutor can help them do this).

Year 10 Mock Interviews with Employers

Monday 10th – Friday 14th November

- Every student in Year 10 will have the opportunity to have a 15 minute interview with a real employer

Questions that could be asked:

The type of questions you may be asked:

- Tell me a little about yourself
- What would your friends say about you?
- What subjects are you studying? (Do you have a favourite?)
- What are you plans at the end of Year 11? (College/apprenticeship?)
- What is your greatest strength?
- Why would you be a good person to employ?
- I have looked at your CV tell me about...

More "situational" questions could be:

- Describe a time when you were faced with a problem and how you dealt with it
- Explain how well you work with other people
- Tell me how effectively you work when not directly supervised

Why undertake work experience? What are the benefits?



- Doing a work experience placement is a great way to find out whether a certain type of career is right for you. It gives you the opportunity to learn new skills, build contacts and experience what it's like working in a real 9-5 job.
- Surveys of employers who participate in WE suggest that:
 - 90% of employers thought that work experience was essential for anyone applying for jobs in the current climate.
 - Whatever you decide to do after you leave CTK, it is likely that you will be competing with young people who have had some kind of experience of work
 - If you are applying to University or for a Higher Apprenticeship, having work experience
 strengthens your application and in many careers it is expected



Soft skills

 Team working, communication skills and commercial awareness

Enhance your application forms and interviews

- Equips you with knowledge that will enhance your job applications and interviews.
- Better understanding of a sector you may want to go into
- Ability to talk with more confidence
- Ask questions that resonate with the employer.

Personal Development

- The technically focused skills you learn will help you start on the professional development path.
- Work experience is the first step towards ticking off competencies.



Year 10 Work Experience

- This is something we need students to start to think about sooner rather than later, as placements fill up very quickly.
- The deadline for students to find a placement is after the easter break on Monday 13th April.
- There are a lot of stages to work experience and we need to ensure these are all completed in preparation for work experience week.



Year 10 Work Experience

- To track placements students use a platform called <u>Unifrog</u>, students will have a link sent to them and encouraged to log on with your support after this information evening.
- Any students who have not logged on will be given time to do so in tutor time on Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd December during PM tutor. This can also be used to add any placements.
- This is something students are encouraged to take ownership of, use their initiative, build communication skills and professionalism with employers.







Year 10 Work Experience

- Students will be emailed a list of past placements to use as a guide and a template email they can edit to send. We recommend contacting your employers to see if they can offer a placement for your child, primary schools, local businesses or any specific industries they are interested in.
- They will have one final session to log placements on Monday 16th March which is before mock exams and the easter holidays start.
- The deadline will then **Monday 13th April**, where we will start to chase employers and parents to fill in their sections.

Students will:

- Find and contact employers to arrange a placement
- Collect all necessary information from employers
- Upload to Unifrog
- Contact employer

School will:

- Check students progress and offer support
- Send reminders to students/employers to upload documents
- Share details of placement arrangements with students
- Prepare students (careers lessons)
- Check documents

Employers will:

- Upload details of their placement
- Share insurance/risk assessment with Unifrog

Unifrog will do the rest!
